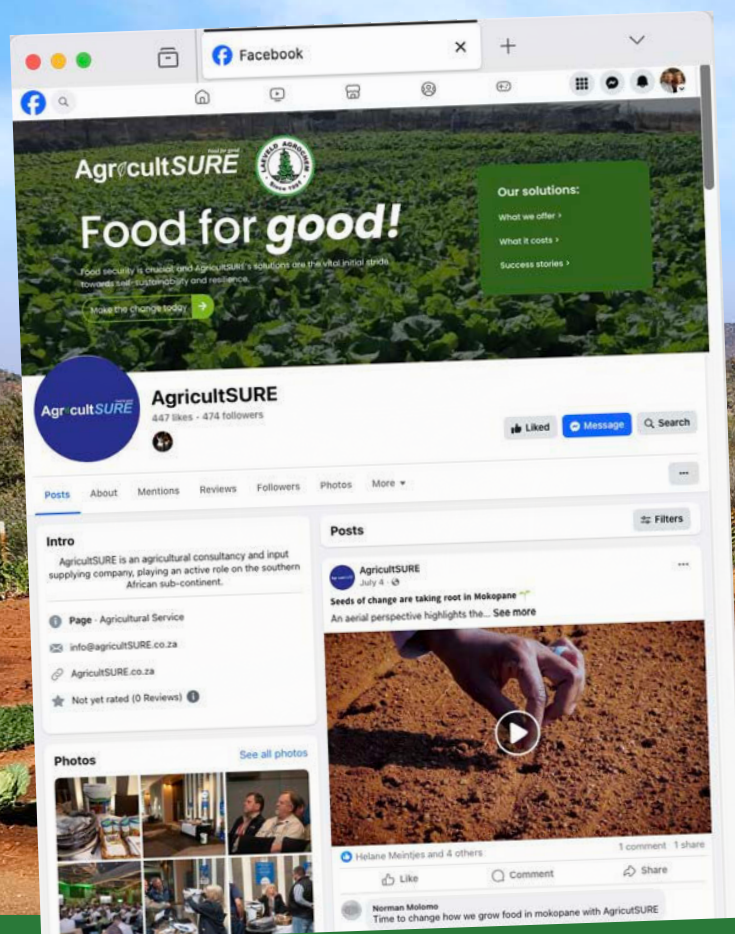

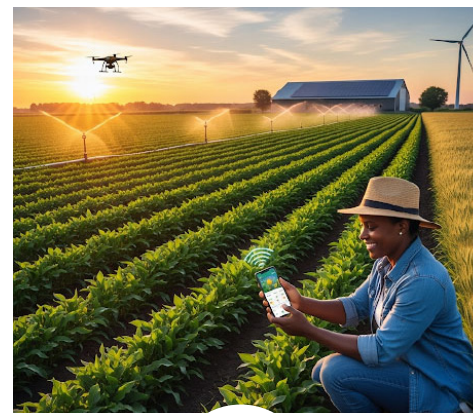

Innovative livelihood restoration

AgricultSURE's initial livelihood restoration program was in Mokopane at a mining group, which included multiple communities and served 300 households.

As a result, some beneficiaries began supplying produce not only to themselves but also to other families and formal retailers in the greater Mokopane area. The program's effectiveness is attributed to a hands-on model that places trained staff within communities to provide daily technical skills transfer. It utilizes technology, such as taking pictures of disease symptoms, to quickly identify and correct crop issues with a network of sister companies. *This process leads to the production of high-quality crops and future plans to enhance the programme's value include establishing a fresh market hub and exploring micro-loan services as an alternative to grants.*

At its core, AgricultSURE's program provides a structured pathway for individuals to transition from potential vulnerability to becoming thriving agripreneurs. The journey commences with the establishment of manageable 15- square-meter household gardens during the first year.

This initial phase serves as an essential training ground, allowing participants to acquire foundational agricultural skills, understand basic farm management principles, and cultivate a sense of ownership and accomplishment. AgricultSURE understands that sustainable change begins with small, achievable steps.

The programme's strength lies in its progressive nature. After the initial year, approximately 40% of the most promising participants are provided the opportunity to expand their operations to 250-square-meter gardens.

This significant scaling-up introduces more complex farming techniques, increased production demands, and a greater understanding of market dynamics. Continuous mentorship and skills transfer from AgricultSURE's dedicated on-the-ground staff ensure that these emerging farmers are well-equipped to navigate these new challenges.

The culmination of this carefully designed progression occurs in the third year, where around 25% of the most successful participants further expand to 2,500-square-meter plots, transitioning into fully economic commercial growers. This crucial stage signifies a move towards self-sufficiency. Beneficiaries at this level, having demonstrated their capabilities and commitment, are no longer reliant on grants. Instead, they gain access to affordable micro-loan facilities, enabling them to invest in essential crop inputs and farming equipment, fostering true economic independence.

What truly distinguishes AgricultSURE's approach is its holistic and community-centric focus. Before any programme is implemented, AgricultSURE conducts a thorough overhead assessment, meticulously evaluating the specific demographics and natural resource availability of the target community. This proactive step ensures that the programme is tailored to local conditions, mitigating potential shortcomings and maximising the chances of success.

Furthermore, AgricultSURE actively facilitates the creation of both informal and formal off-taker hubs. Recognising that the collective produce from numerous smallholder farmers can generate substantial volumes and value, potentially reaching millions of rand and tons of crops, AgricultSURE understands the importance of establishing reliable market linkages.



By connecting growers with buyers, the programme ensures a sustainable demand for the produce, providing long-term economic stability and fostering the growth of local economies. This strategic focus on market access is a testament to AgricultSURE's long-term vision for community empowerment.

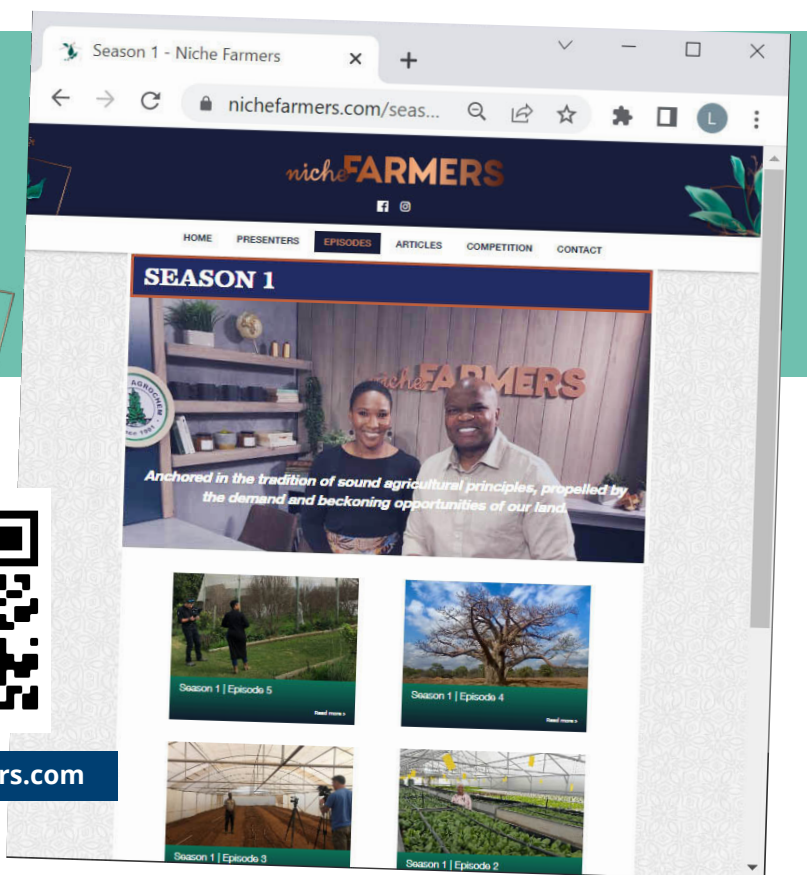

Precision agriculture for small-scale and garden-size growers

Precision agriculture is not limited to large-scale farms. The same science and data-driven methods that improve production on thousands of hectares can also make a measurable difference for smaller fields, market gardens, and intensive home vegetable plots.

By regularly measuring soil conditions, plant nutrient status, and the biological life in your soil, you can apply inputs more efficiently and address problems before they limit yields. This also helps to track improvements from season to season and prevents doing a shotgun approach.

The following services are especially relevant for smaller-scale production.

iTest™ Soil sample – Understanding your soil

Healthy crops start with healthy soil, but the fertility of soil cannot be judged by appearance alone. The iTest™ Soil service analyses your soil's chemical composition and highlights any imbalances that could hold back crop growth. For small-scale growers, one well-taken representative sample per field is usually sufficient. This analysis provides:

Lime requirement to correct soil pH

pH affects how easily plants can absorb nutrients. If the soil is too acidic, elements like phosphorus may become unavailable. If it is too alkaline, micronutrients like zinc and iron may be locked up. The test tells you exactly how much lime, if any, is needed to bring pH into the optimal range for your crop.

Fertiliser recommendations to address specific shortages

Instead of applying a general fertiliser mix, you will know precisely which nutrients are deficient and how much to apply. This reduces waste and prevents excessive levels of nutrients that can harm plants or the environment.

While soil testing shows what nutrients are available, leaf analysis reveals what the plant has actually absorbed at a given growth stage. This direct measurement is essential for verifying that your fertiliser programme is effective.

Nutrients may be present in the soil but not reaching the plant due to pH problems, root health issues, or competition from other elements. The test verifies if plants are getting what they need.

Many nutrient shortages cause yield and quality losses long before visual signs appear. Early detection allows corrective action in time to protect the harvest.

Guide corrective measures

The results indicate whether to use foliar feeding (spraying nutrients directly onto leaves for rapid uptake) or granular fertiliser (for longer-term correction through the soil).

Taking leaf samples at key stages each season, and comparing them year to year, builds a valuable record of plant performance. This history allows you to fine-tune nutrient strategies for each crop and avoid repeating past mistakes.

Value of consistent seasonal data

The real strength of these services is in repetition. A single test is useful, but when you test each season and keep the records (which are available on Agri Technovation's platform MyFarmWeb™), you create a dataset that shows how your soil and plants are responding to your management.

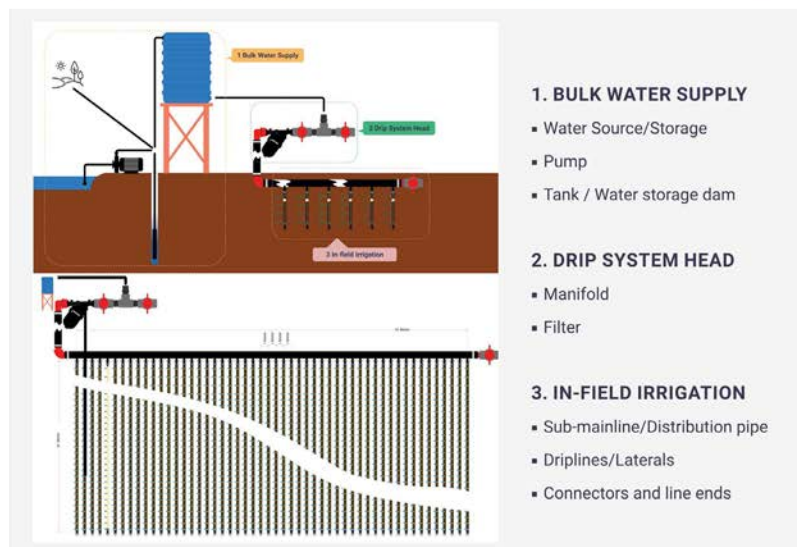

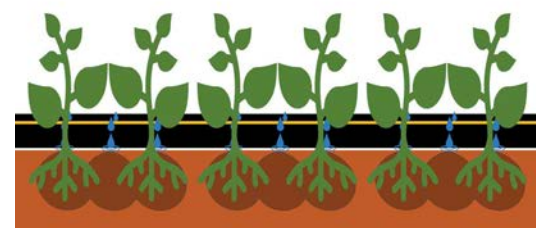
Too little water – crop will not grow properly.

In addition, all excess water is lost and gives no value even though it costs the farmer money. If just the right amount of water is given, the crop grows optimally, and no resources are wasted.

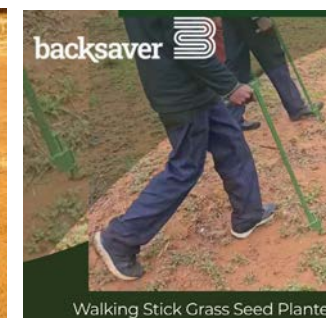

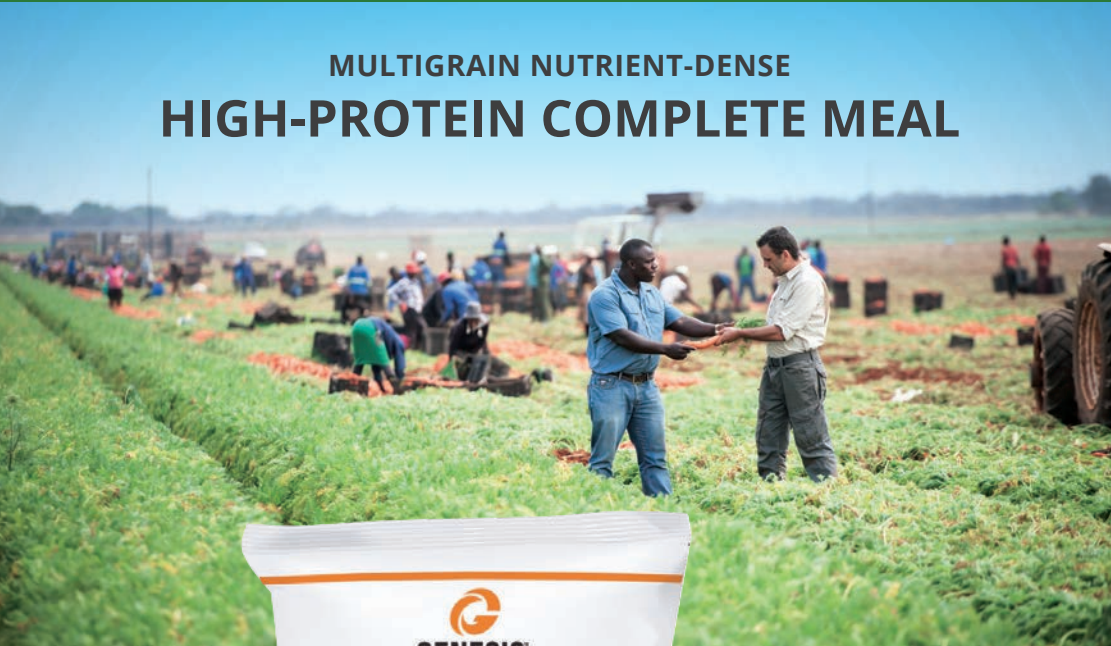
